The Clones Story

The first St. Louis Sisters arrived in Clones on August 10th 1900. They left Monaghan on the 11.20am train reaching Clones at 11.45am! The Clones foundation had been sought for years by Canon Laurence O'Neill, who was a curate in Monaghan when Mother Genevieve and the first sisters arrived from France. He welcomed seven sisters to a Convent he had acquired for them. He also had a school ready and they were able to begin the following Monday, August 13th with 117 pupils, this had risen to 200 by the end of September. There is a sense of great enthusiasm in these early annals. French was introduced with Music and Drawing, but Laundry and Cooking were much to the fore also, school went on until 2.00pm on Saturdays, and it would need to, in order to fit in all the had on hand. There was a huge number of things taught in the general range and Science equipment was bought in 1906.

By January of that first year it was decided to set up a lace class. Lace was a cottage craft on the wane but Fr. O'Neill and the community saw its potential for the area. A temporary teacher was hired until the "very best could be got" and soon a Miss Harris fresh from the College of Art came to Clones. Canon O'Neill at a Committee Meeting in Monaghan is telling the people that the fact "that she was a Protestant made absolutely no difference as long as she was the best lace teacher available." He greatly encouraged this open attitude in not very ecumenical times, and there are records of the continuing good relationship between the community and Protestants of the town. Several of the organisers and inspectors for the National and Technical Boards were Protestants and their pleasure at the progress of the school is always evident. There are records of many exhibitions and prizes at home and abroad. A report on local unemployment in 1905 states, "Were it not for the lace industry kept alive by the Sisters in the Local St. Louis Convent, poverty would reign in many a home. Thanks to the goodness of these ladies they kept up the name of Clones lace by manufacturing and exhibiting it over the world. So great is the demand maintained that there is scarcely a family for miles around Clones but has some member earning between seven and fourteen shillings a week".

The sisters reached out to the local community, and in spring a formal request was made to the Workhouse Board for permission to visit on Sundays. Annals tell of Sunday after Sunday, year in, year out for over twenty years the sisters went to visit until the workhouses were phased out.

But the main project was the school and here there was enormous energy and vitality. "The Sisters are both learning and teaching. Mr. O'Shea gives Irish classes, Miss Clover gives cookery classes and Mr Briscoe comes to teach violin". Pupils progressed through the school, Annie McCarney being one pupil who continued her education in Belfast and later became Sr. Colmcille McCarney. Other pupils were called to Carysfort College.

A school, built on Church Hill was demolished in 1984 the slates were taken to roof a chapel in the Home for the Elderly, Canon O'Neill would have liked that touch, given his famine origins and his care for the Sisters in Monaghan and Clones.
