True religion is not a flight from the world: faith that is alive provides a framework for people to make decisions and take action. As a church, and as a society, we need to reflect with greater depth, urgency, and seriousness about what we must do about climate change. If not for your own sake, then for the sake of your children, and for the world's children – take action.'
